1 Strengthen access to preventive and primary care



Expand multidisciplinary, team-based care to better support prevention and chronic disease management.



Modernise primary care funding models to incentivise early intervention and long-term health outcomes.



Improve care coordination across providers to deliver more seamless, preventative and patient-centred care.

2 Scale innovative models of care



Support modern models of care including Hospital in the Home, virtual care and community based mental health.



Enable more care outside traditional hospital settings, improving consumer choice, access and experience



Reduce avoidable hospital admissions and maximise workforce capacity through prevention programs and efficient care delivery.

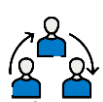
3 Restore access to specialist care



Improve specialist affordability through stronger consumer protections, fee information and referral pathways.



Strengthen workforce capacity by improving workforce planning and expanding clinical training.



Enhance GPs – specialists collaboration through shared-care models and national consultation services to improve access to care.

4 Strengthen private health system sustainability



Increase private health insurance participation through modernising product design to encourage uptake.



Improve private health sector transparency and efficiency through data transparency and Prescribed List reforms.



Strengthen Risk Equalisation arrangements to support a sustainable, efficient and equitable health system over the long term.
